"Heian" is the combination of two characters, 'Hei' & 'An'



The first character is "Hei" and it means flat, even, level, calm, ordinary, and peaceful.

The second character is "An" which means safe, stable, easy, peaceful, or inexpensive.

Note: Fun Fact! The "<u>Heian</u>" katas were originally known as "<u>Pinan</u>" (Which is the Okinawan pronouncement of the exact same characters). The founder of Shotokan karate (Gichin Funakoshi) renamed to "Heian" to be more accepted in Japan.

Note: The word "Heian" is often translated as "Peaceful Mind" (However there is more to it!)







The first of the three (3) kanji in Shotokan is "Sho" and it's made up of two (2) parts! (Public & Tree)




And . . . A Public Tree = Pine = Pine Tree!



Episode # 8: Shotokan

The second kanji in Shotokan is 'to' (which sounds like 'toe'). The kanji is actually representing the 'Soughing' of the wind in the trees which makes a rushing sound.



Try and imagine the sound of the wind rushing through the pine trees and associate it with the kanji shown below! You will have to 'stretch your brain"!



This kanji "to" means the sound of the wind or the sound of waves!

This total kanji (water and wind) 'to' implies the sound of the wind is like the waves of the sea in how it flows. These are imagined as "pine-waves" (putting the first two kanji together).

Note: The waves are the motion of the air moving through the pine needles and the resultant sound. "Wind through the pines."


Note: 'Shoto' was the pen name of Gichin Funakoshi (founder of Shotokan).

Episode # 8: Shotokan

The third and final kanji "kan" is made up of two (2) parts! It means large building or meeting hall! In this case it means 'school.'

Note: The school of 'Shoto'! (Named by his students in honor of him!)


For the first part . . . imagine a roof over a delicious hot meal with chop sticks to eat it!


For the second part, imagine a very 'large' bureaucrat sitting in a room under a roof and he is eating! He has eaten <u>so much</u> that his butt has become very large!


















About the Author
